BRIEF CATHOLIC CATECHISM

THE APOSTLES' CREED

The Apostles' Creed is a vital summary of Catholic faith, encapsulating the essential beliefs handed down by the Apostles. It serves as a profession of faith, especially used in Baptism, where it introduces us to the mysteries of God, the life of Jesus Christ, the workings of the Holy Spirit, and the mission of the Church.

The Creed is divided into three main parts, reflecting the three persons of the Holy Trinity:

- 1. **God the Father** The Creed begins by affirming our belief in God as the Father Almighty, Creator of heaven and earth. This reminds us that God is both powerful and personal, a loving Father who created us and all things.
- 2. **Jesus Christ, the Son** The longest section is dedicated to Jesus, affirming that He is God's only Son, conceived by the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. The Creed outlines Jesus' mission of salvation through His suffering, death, resurrection, and ascension. This part emphasizes that Jesus' life, death, and resurrection bring us redemption and open the way to eternal life.
- 3. **The Holy Spirit** The Creed continues by professing faith in the Holy Spirit, the third person of the Trinity, who sanctifies, guides, and empowers the Church. Through the Holy Spirit, we are united with the Church, the communion of saints, and receive forgiveness of sins.

Finally, the Creed concludes with the belief in the resurrection of the body and life everlasting, reminding us that our faith is oriented toward eternal life with God.

In Catholic teaching, the Apostles' Creed is not just words but a living confession that shapes our entire life. It provides a foundation for our beliefs, reminding us of the truths of faith we live by and the eternal hope we hold in Christ.
